Information for all students

Please remember Iona College's expectations in relation to personal presentation as we begin 2023.

Uniform

All students are expected to have an Iona College school bag and bring all of their school equipment on the first day.

- Years 11 and 12 students are to wear the lona
 College embroidered white shirt, College tie and
 College grey felt hat.
- The College grey felt hat is part of the uniform for Years 11 and 12 and is expected to be worn to and from school.
- Socks are to be always pulled up to the knee at all times. We strongly suggest the use of garters to do this.
- Shoes are to be black, leather school shoes. Black jogger-style shoes are not acceptable.

Haircuts

From Day 1, haircuts are to be in accordance with College expectations:

- Hair must be above the collar at the back, no longer than half-ear at the sides, with sideburns also no longer than half-ear.
- The fringe must remain clear of the eyes and face.
- It is to be a graded, even cut no shorter than a No.2 blade. An 'even cut' means that shorter hair at the back and sides must be blended gradually into longer hair on top. Hair cannot be two distinct lengths (eg: undercut styles are not permitted).
- Layered cuts, use of hair ties, and tinting, colouring, streaking etc. are not permitted.
- Gels or styling creams are not to be used. Radical shaping or styling of hair is not permitted.
- If a fringe is long enough to be tucked behind the ears, it is too long and must be cut.
- Mullet-style haircuts are not permitted. This includes faux or short-mullet styles where the fringe and back of the cut is shorter, with the side above and near the ears being shaved or clipped.

Students whose hair does not meet the College expectations, as outlined above, may be sent home, to return only when the hair is cut or styled in the desirable manner.

Facial Hair

Students in the senior years are to be clean-shaven at all times.

Health and Wellbeing

Please note that the Health and Wellness Centre (HWC) is now open and staff will be in attendance during the following times to receive any medications, consumables, care plans, EpiPens etc:

- Wednesday 10am-1pm
- Thursday 10am-3pm
- Friday 10.30am-3pm

Staff may be away from the HWC outside of these times to attend to Professional Development requirements.

Please advise via email allnurses@iona.qld.edu.au of any changes in medication administration requirements whilst at school, or the commencement of any regular medications for your child over the holiday period – this includes new families commencing at Iona.

Students requiring regular daily medication will now be required to attend between 12.24pm-12.28pm during the transition between Periods 3 and 4 for the administration of medications due to the change in timetable.

This replaces the previous administration time of 11.50am-12pm. Please discuss this important change of time with your child prior to their return.

Please contact the Iona Nurses to discuss any medical issue, or if further clarification is required.

Immunisation Program for Year 7 Students

Our school is participating in Queensland Health's annual School Immunisation Program.

All Year 7 students will be offered free vaccinations as recommended on the National Immunisation Program schedule to protect against vaccine preventable diseases. Year 7 students will be offered human papillomavirus (HPV) and diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough).

- Two doses of human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine GARDASIL®9 will be offered. The recommended interval for the two doses is 0 and (at least) 6 months, but up to 12 months after first dose.
- One booster dose of adult/adolescent formulation dTpa vaccine will be offered. Most students would have received vaccination against diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis when they were pre-school age.

An information booklet contained in the consent pack will be sent home with your child on Wednesday 25 January, and needs to be returned by Wednesday 8 February.

The vaccinations will be conducted by a team of authorised registered nurses and/or a medical practitioner. Parents, legal guardians or authorised persons are encouraged to ensure their children have an adequate breakfast on the morning of vaccination.

The vaccination team will be visiting the school to give the free vaccinations on the following dates:

- Term 1 Wednesday 8 March: HPV Dose 1 + Booster dTpa
- Term 4 Friday 8 September: HPV Dose 2

Drop-off and Pick-up Procedures

Please use the designated drop-off and pick-up zone between Davine and McCarthy ovals (accessed Bulgin Avenue, refer to the attached College campus map for details).

Students may only enter and exit the vehicle from the left side, and only when you are in the drop-off/pick-up zone marked in yellow on the road. Please do not allow students to exit the vehicle at the top of the hill.

The drop-off/pick-up zone operates as a flowing drop-off zone like a taxi rank. Please pull forward to the frontmost available bay to drop off or pick up your child.

DO NOT drop off or pick up your child until you have safely stopped in the marked bays. This area is supervised by staff, and anyone impeding traffic will be directed to leave and re-join the queue.

The drop-off and pick-up zone does become busy at peak times, and we request your patience and cooperation to ensure that the process is safe and efficient.

Other safe options that are available to you and your child are:

 The bus turnaround off North Road is available AFTER 3.30PM ONLY, as pick-up before this time restricts the Translink buses' access to this zone.

Drop off in the morning is permitted, as buses do not arrive at the same time in the mornings.

This drop-off/pick-up zone operates as a flowing taxi rank. Please pull forward as much as possible to prevent traffic build up on North Road.

- Drop off/pick up on the school side of Sandy Camp Road and North Road. If collecting your child on the opposite side of North Road, they must use the Graham's Crossing traffic lights to cross the road.
- Pick up your child at 3.25pm when the majority of traffic has cleared.

Please DO NOT drop off or pick up at the following areas, as these areas present serious safety risks to the students:

 Under IPAC. If your child has a rehearsal in the morning, they are to be dropped off in the bus turnaround.

- Daly carpark behind the chapel
- Grassed area beside the North Road driveway
- Outside Administration
- Chapel carpark
- Any internal carparks
- North Road bus turnaround for pick-up before 3.30pm.

Medical Drop-off/Pick-up Procedure

The medical turnaround drop-off/pick-up zone is only to be used for emergencies, or medically related student departures.

All students needing to depart the College for a medical reason will wait in the Health and Wellness Centre for pick up.

Please drive around the roundabout past Main Reception and reverse cautiously towards the HWC.

You do not need to report to Main Reception for a medical student departure – please proceed directly to the HWC.
