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



THE HOUSE SYSTEM

- In Years 5 & 6, the house system supports the academic, sporting and co-curricular activities
- It becomes the primary vehicle for pastoral care and student welfare in Years 7 to 12
- There are 10 College Houses
- Each House contains approximately 150 students from Years 7 to 12

 - 4 x Year 10 students, 4 x Year 11 students and 4 x Year 12 students



iBELONG ORIENTATION PROGRAM

- Year 7 specific program aimed at creating social cohesion
- Mixture of:
 - o Academic classes,
 - o Social activities (house based),
 - o Orientation of campus & surrounds,
 - o And culture and ethos
- Guided around campus by Year 13's
- Opportunity for boys to settle into routines of the College and ask questions to boys who have 'travelled the journey' already.

HAIRSTYLES AT IONA

Hair must:

- Remain clear of the eyes and face;
- Be above the collar at the back;
- Be no longer than half ear at the sides with sideburns also no longer than half ear;
- Be graded, even cut, no shorter than blade 2;
- Not have gel or other hair products in it;
- Not have a fringe that is long enough to be tucked behind the ears;
- There are to be no mullet style haircuts. This includes short mullet styles where the fringe and back of the cut is shorter, with the side above and near the ears being shaved.
- In rare circumstances, an exemption to aspects of the haircut guidelines, can be requested.
- A process exists to support students where religious, cultural or medical circumstances impact the presentation of hair.
- In the first instance please speak with either Mr. Holmes or Mr O'Brien if you would like to apply on these grounds.














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
