Iona College looks forward to welcoming you and your son into our College community next year. We understand a student's transition to a new school places a level of anxiety on all families as they adjust to the change and new routines.

Iona conducts sports trials in Term 4 to provide boys with the opportunity to meet their future classmates, make new friends and become more comfortable with their new school before commencing the new school year.

Iona College is a member of the AIC (Associated Independent Colleges) Sports Association, which is a schoolboy sports competition involving students from Years 5–12.

In total, there are eight member schools in the AIC competition. These schools play each other in the various sports offered throughout the year.

Iona College offers opportunities for its students to represent the College in a wide variety of sports throughout the year.

This booklet will summarise the sporting arrangements on offer in Term 1 only for all new Year 5 and Year 7 students entering Iona College in 2024.

As the AIC season in Term 1 begins the very first week of the 2024 school year, we believe it is best to conduct all trials at the end of this year, with the aim to have all teams and squads selected before the end of 2023.

This will allow the College's sports program to run smoothly at the commencement of the 2024 school year. Conducting and completing sports trials in the previous year also lessens the burden and worry placed on students and their families as they enter their very first week at Iona College in 2024.

Students entering Iona College in 2024 have the option of participating in the following sports in Term 1:

Year 5	Cricket or AFL, and swimming (no volleyball) – students choose between cricket or AFL, not both as they are both played on Saturday mornings. All students can participate in swimming.	Cricket, AFL and volleyball One to two training sessions held weekly in Term 1 before or after school. Matches to be played on Saturday morning/afternoon each week during Term 1.
Year 7	Cricket, AFL or volleyball and swimming – students choose between cricket, volleyball or AFL only as they are all played on Saturday. All students can participate in swimming.	Swimming Up to four training sessions offered before or after school. Swim meets will be held on Friday afternoons after school until approx. 5/6pm. Bus transportation is provided when the meets are not hosted at Iona.

Below are the maximum number of teams permitted by the AIC competition to be nominated in each sport for 2024. Unfortunately, given the restricted team numbers in AFL and volleyball, a position in these sports is not guaranteed.

Year 5 AFL	–	three teams
Year 5 & 7 Cricket	–	unlimited teams (no one misses out)
Year 5 & 6 Swimming	–	available to all who can swim at least 50m in two strokes
Year 7 AFL	–	two teams
Year 7 Volleyball	–	four teams

Those who trial for AFL and volleyball and do not make a team are welcome to join a cricket team if they choose.

Students who wish to participate in these sports are asked to complete the 'Online Sign-on' form via the link below.

All students are then required to participate in the trials for these sports held during Term 4 of 2023. All trial information, including trial dates and venues, can be found within this document.

Please complete all online information by Friday 13 October, or earlier if your son wishes to join our swim program commencing Week 1 of Term 4, 2023. Following is a checklist to help you with the sign-on process.

- Complete the 'Term 1 2024 – online sport sign-on' form to indicate which sport your son wishes to participate in during Term 1, 2024 (sport sign-on forms for other sports offered in Terms 2, 3 and 4 will be distributed next year).
- Complete the '2024 Coach, Manager and Officials – Online Nomination Form' if you wish to assist the College with one of these positions next year. Given the College's many teams in each sport, Iona relies on parents, Old Boys and volunteers to assist the sports program where needed. The assistance from the parent body is needed to cover all roles.
- The Iona swim program is open to all students who are enrolled at the College for 2024. A student may choose to stay with his current club or join our swimming program next year. We encourage boys to start swimming early at the Iona College pool as regular training strengthens our squad and helps to build a positive team culture.
- All cricket, AFL and volleyball trials will be held in Term 4, 2023. Students are to arrive at the venue 15 minutes prior to the advertised start time.
- Further information regarding times, dates, what to wear to trials, etc. is found within this document.

It is not necessary for a player to have any prior experience playing cricket, AFL or volleyball. We encourage as many new players as possible to try out.

Please note: While we encourage boys to play club sport, the Iona College policy clearly states that all students should give priority to school sport commitments over club commitments.

If your son is interested in participating in the sports offered, please complete all the necessary online forms by the due dates listed. Please feel free to contact the respective coordinators listed below if you have any concerns or questions.

Note: All cricket, volleyball and Year 5–9 AFL is played on Saturday. Therefore, students may trial for only one of these sports. Any boy may register for swimming on top of the other sports played in Term 1.

- Iona College expects full commitment from all players to all training sessions and games (within reason). Clashes with other Iona co-curricular commitments can be negotiated via the Sports Office.

- All players are to conduct themselves in the appropriate manner in accordance with our Oblate Catholic values.
- Be supportive of fellow teammates and other teams.
- Always wear the full and correct uniform with pride.
- Enjoy the sport and give your best when representing Iona College.

AIC CRICKET AND AFL TRIALS – NEW YEAR 5 STUDENTS 2024

Students entering Year 5 in 2024 will have the opportunity to trial for cricket or AFL over two to three weeks in Term 4. These trials are open to all new Year 5 students who are enrolled at Iona College in 2024. Please note that in the AIC competition, the boys compete in their year level, not their age groups.

All students must attend all sessions to be considered for team selection in 2024. If your son is unable to attend a session, please contact the relevant coordinator using the contact details below.

What to wear?

All students who wish to trial for cricket or AFL are required to wear normal day clothes suitable for playing that sport to the trials.

Students may wear their current school's sport uniform (including a hat, for cricket). AFL players should wear a shirt that is suitable for tackling, football boots and must wear a mouthguard.

Parents may purchase the Iona cricket and AFL uniform after the completion of these trials in readiness for 2024. There is no need to purchase the uniforms before these trials.

The College will loan jerseys to students for all AFL trial games.

What to bring?

As the cricket and AFL equipment is supplied by the College, it is not necessary to bring your own equipment to the trials, but boys may bring their own cricket equipment if they wish.

The College can only submit a maximum of three teams into the Year 5 division of the AIC AFL competition. After Session 4, the AFL squad/teams will be announced.

Unfortunately, some boys will miss out, and they will not be required to attend Sessions 5 & 6. Those boys who miss out will be offered a place in a cricket team, as there are no limits to the number of cricket teams we can enter.

Commitment required?

All teams will have one or two training sessions before or after school each week throughout Term 1.

All cricket and AFL games will be played on Saturday mornings during Term 1, as per the College calendar (please find a version of this calendar located towards the end of this document). Training times for all teams will be advised next year.

Students playing in trials must arrive at least 15 minutes before the allocated time of the Saturday sessions. We ask families to arrive as close as possible to the times organised for the sessions held during the week. We are aware that some families may arrive later as their drive from their current school may be a greater distance.

Please note that students may participate in cricket or AFL and the swimming program in 2023/24.

AIC CRICKET, AFL AND VOLLEYBALL TRIALS – NEW YEAR 7 STUDENTS 2024

Students entering Year 7 in 2024 will have the opportunity to trial for cricket, volleyball or AFL over two to three weeks in Term 4. These trials are open to all current and new Year 7 students who are enrolled at Iona College in 2024. Please note that in the AIC competition, the boys compete in their year level, not their age groups.

All students must attend all sessions to be considered for team selection in 2024. If your son is unable to attend a session, please contact the relevant coordinator using the contact details below.

What to wear?

All students who wish to trial for cricket, volleyball or AFL are required to wear normal day clothes suitable for playing that sport for the trials. Students may wear their current school's sport uniform (including a hat for cricket). AFL players should wear a shirt that is suitable for tackling, football boots and must wear a mouthguard.

Parents may purchase the Iona cricket, volleyball and AFL uniform after the completion of these trials in readiness for 2024. There is no need to purchase the uniforms before these trials.

The College will loan jerseys to students for all AFL trial games.

What to bring?

As the cricket, volleyball and AFL equipment is supplied by the College, it is not necessary to bring your own equipment to the trials, but boys may bring their own cricket equipment if they wish.

The College can only submit a maximum of two teams into the Year 7 division of AIC AFL, and a maximum of four teams in the Year 7 division of AIC volleyball competition.

After Session 4, the AFL squad/teams will be announced. Due to the predicted large numbers, some volleyball trialist will be reduced after Session 3. Therefore, some boys will miss out, and they will not be required to attend either Sessions 4, 5 & 6. Those boys who miss out will be offered a place in a cricket team, as there are no limits to the number of cricket teams we can enter.

Commitment required?

All teams will have one or two training sessions, either before or after school, each week throughout Term 1. All AFL and volleyball games will be played on Saturday mornings, and all Year 7 cricket games may be played morning or afternoon during Term 1 as per the College calendar (please find a version of this calendar located towards the end of this document). Training times for all teams will be advised next year.

Students playing in trials must arrive at least 15 minutes before the allocated time on the Saturday sessions. We ask families to arrive as close as possible to the times organised for the sessions held during the week. We are aware that some families may arrive later as their drive from their current school may be a greater distance.

Please note that students may participate in cricket or volleyball or AFL, and the swimming program, in 2023/24.

IONA SWIMMING TRAINING – 2023/2024

Iona College is a member of the AIC (Associated Independent Colleges) which is a school-based competition involving students from Years 5–12. The annual AIC Swimming Championship will be held in Week 7 of Term 1, 2024.

For Iona College to be competitive and to do well, we urge all current students and those who will commence their education at Iona College in 2024 to commence swimming training NOW.

While the College appreciates that some students may choose to continue their pre-season training elsewhere, we would encourage all swimmers to consider joining the College's program.

All interested students are invited to commence their training at Iona College from Week 1 of Term 4. These sessions are free of charge to all current students as well as those enrolled into the College in 2024.

Participation in our pre-season schedule will not guarantee a place in our final squad, however, it will strengthen your chance to do well at the trials and aid in building a strong Iona College swimming culture.

All training sessions will be held at the Iona College pool under the direction of the Iona College Head Coach, Mr Zane King, and Assistant Head Coach, Mr Nic Keune. Training is open to all students who hope to become a member of Iona's 2024 Swim Team, or for students wishing to increase their physical fitness.

Please note that these sessions are for students who are capable swimmers only. They are not 'learn to swim' sessions. Parents who are looking for 'learn to swim' sessions may wish to enrol their son/s in an alternate program. Please contact our Head Coach for further details.

If you wish to join the swim squad, please contact the Head Coach using the details below. The coaches will warmly welcome all newcomers and assess the swimmer's ability at the initial session.

From here, the coaches may invite swimmers to join other programs based on their ability, including our elite programs, or to stay in the program/timeslots stated below. Students may choose to take advantage of one or more sessions per week.

SELECTION GUIDELINES & CODE OF CONDUCT






- When signing on for a sport at Iona College, it will be the understanding of the College that players and parents do so knowing, agreeing, and accepting the terms and conditions listed below.
- Iona College endeavours to provide opportunities for as many students as possible to participate and enjoy the experience of playing sport. All parents, players and coaching staff have the responsibility to ensure that they contribute towards this experience being a positive one for all involved.
- All A & B teams from Years 7–11, and most Year 12 teams, contest the AIC aggregate for that sport. In doing so, boys are trained specifically to fulfil a certain role which is determined by the coach within that team, which may result in a player not playing in every position. For example, not all players in cricket will share equally the bowling, batting and keeping duties from week to week in these teams.
- A & B teams and most Open teams are classified as competitive teams, which contest premierships and aggregates. C teams and lower are participatory teams, whereby the main focus would be to allow all participants to 'have a go' and enjoy the experience. C teams and lower may still contest premierships or aim for an undefeated season. A & B teams train twice weekly, C teams and lower train at least once per week and maybe twice, depending on the sport, coach and availability of facilities.
- Premierships are not awarded to any Year 5 or 6 teams. Teams will be acknowledged if they remain undefeated throughout the regular season.
- Coaches will select the most appropriate players to suit the overall balance of the team. For example, a basketball coach would not select more than two point guards. In rugby, not everybody can play the fly-half position.
- The selection of all coaches is determined by the College. Iona College aims to include as many teams as possible into the AIC competition based on the resources available. Due to the large number of teams Iona generates for each sport, it is impossible to have all teams taken by staff members or independent / external coaches. Parents and Old Boys are often required to fulfil coaching roles.
- Coaches are appointed specifically by the Sports Department based on coaching experience, willingness to support the College's program and ethos, as well as a proven ability to foster, develop and maintain good relationships with members of the Iona community. The specific positioning of a coach will be based on the overall strategic needs of the College for that sport.
- All coaches must hold a Blue Card.
- Parents are asked not to undermine, or contribute towards any negativity directed at, the coach. Matters of concern should be made directly by the person concerned (not others acting on their behalf) to a member of the Sports Department, or to the coach directly if done so in a respectful and discreet manner.

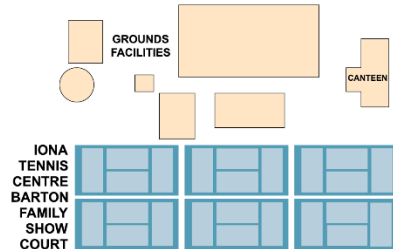
- In no way is it acceptable for a parent (who is not the appointed coach) to intervene with any team selections or get involved in coaching sessions unless invited by the coach or the Sports Department. Most coaches are volunteers, and without them your son would not be participating.
- Matters of team selection will always be an issue. As there is a finite number in each team, it is inevitable that players will miss out and be relegated to lower teams. Selections are based on player performance, attitude and attendance. It is in the best interest of players and parents to be resilient and accepting of decisions made. Matters of concern should be dealt with as listed above.
