

#### Your new station

The Lindum station upgrade is being delivered as part of the Queensland Government's commitment to make our stations fully accessible for all of our customers.

This will mean people in wheelchairs, parents with prams, and those with heavy luggage can get easy access to our trains.

# Key features of this vitally important accessibility upgrade:

- ✓ a new footbridge with lift access
- upgraded North Road park 'n' ride, including new active transport enclosure
- $\checkmark$  improved accessible parking, including kiss 'n' ride
- ✓ full-length, high level platforms and new seating
- upgraded hearing augmentation loops and tactile ground surface indicators
- $\checkmark\,$  upgraded security cameras and lighting
- $\checkmark$  new wayfinding and platform signage
- ✓ accessible toilets and ticket windows
- new station building and extended platform shelters.

# Lindum station accessibility upgrade

#### Alternative transport while we build a better station for our community

Queensland Rail is upgrading Lindum station to make it more accessible for everyone.

To fast-track construction and deliver the upgrade as safely as possible, the station will temporarily close from 22 January 2024.

Recently, we asked the community to provide feedback on how you'd like to travel during the closure.

Information collected from community surveys has been used to develop alternative transport options, to ensure we continue to meet your travel needs during this time.

## Alternative transport options

### 🛱 Bus service

- Shuttle bus 229 will operate between Lindum and Wynnum North stations, including a stop on North Road opposite Iona College.
- The shuttle will operate every 10-15 minutes in peak hour (7am to 9am and 3pm to 4pm on weekdays), with additional services running to support school start and finish times.
- Outside of peak hour, route 229 will connect with arriving trains at Wynnum North station.
- Existing bus route 224 will also be available from Sibley Road.
- All route 229 services will be accessible.

#### Nearby train stations

- Wynnum North and Hemmant are the nearest stations to Lindum and will remain open during the upgrade works.
- Limited parking will be available at Lindum station for those catching the 229 shuttle.
